Seminar Description

Held at the High Tech High Graduate School of Education in San Diego, CA, Cultural Crossroads is a thematic seminar that interweaves content related to both the Holocaust and present-day experiences of intolerance and persecution. The seminar is inquirybased, inviting teachers to acknowledge and incorporate the culture of their students into their curriculum and the broader classroom experience. The program takes a writing-based approach to Holocaust and social justice education.

Visits to the New Americans Museum, Museum of Man, Border Field State Park, and Chicano Park


Shabbat Service, Dinner, Klezmer Performance
