An intensive, inquiry-based seminar for educators focused on human rights lessons from the past to forge a new path into the future

St. Cloud State Univ., St. Cloud, MN

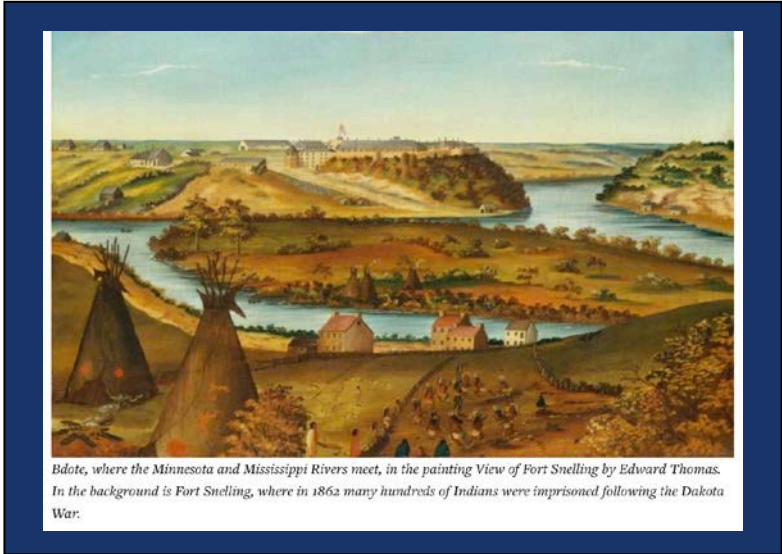
August 4 - 10, 2019

Using inquiry- and writing-based pedagogy, participants will engage with primary source materials and survivor testimonies to examine the roots of anti-Semitism and anti-Indian sentiment and consider connections to current social justice issues.

Day trips will include visits to Mt. Zion Temple (St. Paul) and Bdote/Fort Snelling.

Participants will experience best practices and new educational approaches to teaching about the Holocaust and other genocides, with a focus on hope for the future.

Participants will leave with action plans and resources for implementing Holocaust and genocide education in their classrooms.
