Summer Seminar for Educators in All Disciplines

Educators will assume the roles of student and teacher as they deepen their knowledge of the Holocaust and Jewish culture and refine their teaching practice.

Participants will:

- Use a multi-disciplinary, social justice-focused inquiry process to explore past and recent genocides.
- Hear from a variety of speakers, including Holocaust survivors, writers, educators, scholars, and a rabbi.
- Study and reflect on methods for implementing action-oriented social justice curriculum with students.
- Develop standards-based curriculum materials and strategies for teaching about the Holocaust and other genocides.

Institute Facilitators:



Cara Crandall, Ed.D., an ELA teacher in Longmeadow, MA, is a 25-year educator who has taught about the Holocaust and social justice throughout her career, including leadership in the Holocaust Educators Network.



Momodou Sarr, is a special education teacher who taught in Amherst, MA for 18 years. He is a member of the executive board and co-director of a program at the Western Massachusetts Writing Project at the University of Massachusetts, Amherst.
